Alpine Hills MUSEUM

The focal point of downtown Sugarcreek, Alpine Hills Museum contains three floors of historical artifacts local to Sugarcreek and the surrounding area depicting the early days of the Swiss and Amish heritage unique to this area. Your trip to the museum starts with a twelve-minute video presentation on the Amish culture and the impact of the Swiss immigrants, which resulted in the local area's rich history of Swiss Cheese making. Your tour continues through numerous interactive audio-visual displays that take you back to an earlier era including 1895 fire equipment, an Amish kitchen, a replica of an 1890 cheese house, an early wood shop with hand tools and early printing equipment, and more! Don't miss the display of our Swiss Alp Horns! Admission to the Alpine Hills Museum is free but donations are always accepted and appreciated. The Sugarcreek Information Center is located in the lobby of the museum, offering free information about many other area attractions.
