Travel back in time to the splendor of the Victorian Era at the J.E. Reeves Home and Carriage House Museum. In 1901 Dover Industrialist Jeremiah Reeves finished work on a 19th century farmhouse that he had converted into a 17-room mansion with all of the amenities of wealth and elegant living expected of the time. The completely furnished and restored home includes many original pieces belonging to the Reeves Family. Come visit the home today and see it as a guest of the family would have 100 years ago. Our guided tours give visitors the chance to see every room of the house from the elegant dining room to the third-floor grand ballroom.

Guests are also invited to browse among the many treasures located in the home's Carriage House Museum. Fashioned in a Queen Anne style, the Carriage House features such treasures as a Rausch and Lang Electric Car, an 1892 carriage and a doctor's buggy. The Carriage House also features a brand new exhibit on the Ohio & Erie Canal in Dover. The exhibit focuses on Dover's growth as a canal town during the 19th century.
