



Historic Schoenbrunn Village

Founded in 1772 as a Moravian mission to more than 300 Delaware Indians who constructed the first Christian church and school in Ohio. Schoenbrunn (which means "beautiful spring") has a history that features a rare meeting of Indian and European cultures and a fascinating perspective on the American Revolution. Currently operated by the Dennison Depot, the village is an Ohio Historical Society site.

Today the reconstructed village contains seventeen log buildings, gardens and the original mission cemetery. The museum and visitor center feature artifacts from archaeological digs and a video depicting the story of this short-lived settlement and the struggle to survive. Volunteers in eighteenth-century dress bring this unique community to life. It is close to Schoenbrunn Amphitheater, home of *Trumpet in the Land*, Ohio's longest-running outdoor drama which tells the story of the founding of Schoenbrunn and the massacre at Gnadenhutten. Special guided tours with costumed interpreters are available by request. Call for more information on group meal packages!
